Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN)

A few facts about the program:

- The RN to BSN program is a post-licensure pathway designed for students who have obtained a Washington RN license by the time classes start.
- The RN to BSN program is a selective admission program. Selective admission criteria are used when there are more applicants to the program than seats available.
- Graduates of LCC's associate degree nursing program (AN-DTA/MRP) may be able to complete the RN to BSN program in as little as one year (3 quarters) of full-time enrollment (15 credits per quarter, 45 credits total).
- This is a hybrid program, with classes meeting in-person four evenings per quarter.
- Full-time classes begin fall 2025 and part-time classes begin summer 2025.
