Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: To bring Lower Columbia College's student conduct code ch. 132M-126 WAC into compliance with a new final rule governing sex discrimination grievance procedures (Title IX procedures) recently adopted by the United States Department of Education pursuant to its authority under Title IX of the Education Amendment of 1972 and to update other provisions of the student conduct code to reflect current issues and needs of the District and its students. These updates ensure that the code's prohibited conduct and procedures adequately protect the interests of the college community and the constitutional and procedural rights of individual students. The college proposes to repeal now outdated Title IX procedures and to repeal the existing student code of conduct and replace it with an updated student code that includes required Title IX procedures..

Reasons supporting proposal: Lower Columbia College must revise their chapter 132M-126 WAC to meet new federal regulations for Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (Title IX) that specify how recipients of Federal financial assistance covered by Title IX, including post-secondary institutions, must respond to allegations of sexual discrimination
