Increasing College Graduation Rates Benefits Everyone

Communities with higher educational attainment rates tend to fare better across a variety of indicators. Education levels correlate with literacy, unemployment and household income statistics, for example. Educational attainment is also strongly associated with health outcomes, including quality of life.

Lower Columbia College (LCC) has been providing certificate and associate degree options to the community since 1934. In 2019, we rolled out our first Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) degree, in teacher education. We added a second BAS degree in organizational leadership and technical management in 2022. These local options are sorely needed given that our bachelor's degree attainment

rate is about half the state average. Many additional undergraduate and graduate degree options are available through our partners at the Lower Columbia Regional University Center, located on the LCC campus.

LCC Foundation Names the Wollenberg Foundation as Benefactor of the Year

Benefactor honorees have a history of providing financial support to the foundation, and/or significant volunteer service to the college. Contributions from honorees have substantially impacted college programs, students, and the community.

"It is with great pleasure that we honor The Wollenberg Foundation as this year's LCC Benefactor of the Year," said Jenny Isaacson, LCC Foundation Board Chair. "Members of the Wollenberg family have been among the most influential business leaders and philanthropists in our community. The family continues to impact our community and college through their generosity," she added.

For over 30 years, The Wollenberg Foundation has supported LCC with gifts totaling nearly \$950,000. The Wollenberg family is passionate about early childhood education and helped establish LCC's Head Start Program. Other LCC support includes the library, scholarships, and unrestricted giving. Due to

their generous support of LCC's Rose Center for the Arts project, the family was honored by the naming of the Wollenberg Auditorium.

"LCC is fortunate to have supporters like the Wollenbergs whose gifts will continue to benefit students and our community for years to come," said Kendra Sprague, LCC Vice President of Foundation, Human Resources, & Legal Affairs.

Like the beginnings of Longview itself, the Wollenberg family is rooted in timber. Their storied history in the community began in 1926, when Harry L. Wollenberg was recruited by longtime friend, Monroe Wertheimer, to help establish Longview Fibre Company.

Harry was the first of three generations to serve as the company's CEO. Harry's son, Richard P. (Dick) Wollenberg, was CEO from 1978-2001

and passed in 2014 at the age of 98. His wife, Leone (Lee) Wollenberg, served on the LCC Foundation Board from

1981 to 1993, including service as president. She died in 2006. Their son, Rick Wollenberg, served as CEO from 2001 until 2007, when the company was sold. He and his wife, Barbara, are carrying the family's community legacy forward today. They credit Rick and David's father and grandfather for passing on the value of community. The

family's foundation is headed by Rick, his brother David Wollenberg, and cousin Chris Wollenberg.

"The Wollenberg Foundation is a charitable foundation established by Harry Wollenberg in 1952. A majority of our funding is for education, including early childhood education such as the Head Start program which is essential for lifelong success," shares Rick Wollenberg. "It is a real privilege to help support all generations of community members by providing educational opportunities for all," he added.





Student Success Grants

Students are awarded more than \$550,000 each year through the LCC Foundation. In 2021-22, the Foundation provided \$1.06 million in support to the college. Nearly 52% was direct student support.

Because of you, our generous donors, each year the LCC Foundation offers more than 250 scholarships to hardworking students. Scholarship award categories include annual and athletic scholarships, endowed scholarships, and emergency Student Success Fund grants for students in need.





A special thanks to our community partner, The Daily News, for their continued support through the Students in Need campaign. Last year, "Students in Need" raised over \$30,000 for the Student Success Fund.

Student Success Fund

The Student Success Fund provides emergency grants to LCC students who are most at-risk for abandoning higher education goals due to financial hardships. It provides vital support to encourage students to complete their degrees.

Since 2012, the fund has provided nearly \$600,000 in emergency grants to nearly 1,000 students. The average award is approximately \$600. For many students, this grant means the difference between completing their education or dropping out.

The Student Success Fund works! Completion rates for LCC's Student Success Fund recipients are nearly double that of all LCC students.

2021-22 A Return to Normalcy

The Lower Columbia College athletics program rebounded from the pandemic to do what they do best — win in competition and succeed in the classroom. After three years dealing with schedule disruptions, COVID-19 protocols, and all of the stress that comes with it, the Red Devils finally settled back into a more normal existence.


The six athletic teams at LCC went a combined 127-61-1 for a winning percentage of 68%. In the classroom, the teams had a combined GPA of 3.18 including 63 quarters where an LCC student/ athlete earned a 4.0 GPA.

The biggest thrill of the 2021-22 season was Lower Columbia winning the NWAC women's basketball championship for the first time in school history. It came down to a final shot at the buzzer in overtime to cap off an incredible 26-1 season for Lucas Myers' Red Devils.

The Lower Columbia men's basketball team won a second straight West Region championship and advanced to the NWAC Sweet 16 before being upset at the NWAC Championships in Everett. Head coach Mickey Polis put together an exciting team that had fans coming out of their seats on several occasions.

The Lower Columbia women's soccer team continued to make strides under the leadership of head coach. loe Chicks. The Devils were 8-7-1 and just missed a playoff berth out of the ultra-tough West Region.

team, led by Carri Smith, also competed in a talented division and ended with a record of 12-10. The Devils were led by All-American libero Emma Nelson, and the team advanced to the NWAC Sweet 16.

The Red Devil softball team had another solid season under the longest tenured head coach at LCC, Traci Fuller. The Devils were led by slugger Katelyn McGough who hit 22 homers on the way to a 7th place finish in the NWAC.

The Lower Columbia baseball team's quest for a fourth straight NWAC championship fell just three runs short. Kurt Lupinski took over as the new head coach and he had the Devils in contention. After two wins at the NWAC tournament at Story Field, the Devils dropped a one-run game to eventual champ, Linn Benton, and then ended up 4th after a 3-1 loss to runner-up Mt. Hood.

The Shot You Dream Of

Thousands of children play out the scenario in their driveway. With a basketball in their hands they count down to the final shot that wins the game! They play it out again and this time the shot wins the championship!

Not many of those kids get to live the dream. But, Chinedu Nnadi of Lower Columbia did. With time counting down in overtime at the 2021-22 NWAC championship game, Nnadi got the pass at the top of the key and let it fly. As the ball sailed towards the bucket, the horn sounded. And it was nothing but net! Nnadi was mobbed by her teammates as LCC had won its first-ever women's title with a 76-75 victory over Peninsula College.

The winning assist came from teammate Michaela Harris, who earlier sent the game into overtime with a heroic three-pointer herself. Harris' long three with nine seconds left in regulation set the stage for Nnadi's championship winner.

Both Nnadi and Harris had been through a lot in three years at Lower Columbia. They both were

granted an extra year of eligibility because of the pandemic. There were certainly plenty of highs and lows during their time in Longview, but you can't get much higher than what happened on Sunday, March 27th in Everett.

Nnadi and Harris were best friends at LCC and they were known as outstanding student-athletes who danced their way to success. Literally. It was a common sight at the Stoller Athletic Center to see them working on their latest dance moves.

Both moved on to the next level, Nnadi at Point University in Georgia and Harris at Art University in California. But, it will be hard to top what they accomplished as Red Devils.

Mark McCrady Named 2022 LCC Alumnus of the Year

Mark graduated Kelso High School in 1974 and began attending LCC in the fall. Without enough money to attend a second year, he went to work for Longview Fibre working as a pipefitter where his supervisor encouraged him to continue his education. Fibre's tuition reimbursement program provided the catalyst to return to school. With perseverance, Mark earned his first LCC degree in Industrial Maintenance in 1983 and graduated side-by-side with his wife, Theresa, who

simultaneously earned her Nursing degree from LCC. When LCC launched the Multi-Craft Technology program, Mark re-enrolled and earned his second LCC degree in 1989.

Mark credits his career and public service accomplishments to the educational foundation he received from LCC.

Mark and Theresa (Schuh) have two children and three grandchildren. Mark and his family remain actively involved at LCC. The McCrady family's educational legacy at LCC continues with nine members of the McCrady family obtaining a total of 12 associate degrees since the 1970s.

Mark's dedication to public and community service is demonstrated

through his service on several local boards, as Longview City Councilman and Mayor, and Cowlitz PUD Commissioner. In 2007, his family combined efforts with three nursing program alumni who wanted to establish an endowed scholarship for nursing students through a matching funds gift. LCC's Nursing faculty also joined the efforts to continue building the scholarship principal. That fund provides annual scholarship awards educating generations of nurses into

perpetuity. Mark shares, "To me, the lesson is a simple one. If we all do a little, big things happen." In 2015, Mark collaborated with his three brothers to honor and memorialize

their parents, Roy and Colleen McCrady, through an LCC scholarship endowment and named the nursing lounge in their honor. Mark's community and LCC pride motivate him to help others become the best people they can be.

When asked to share LCC's impact on his life and others, Mark humbly responded, "Thanks to LCC's flexibility and dedicated faculty, students can attend school while working, which results in more people being able to prepare for and advance their careers."

Nicole Page Blazes Pipe Welding Trail

After working at a jewelry store repairing watches for several years, a chance encounter with a former middle school counselor led Nicole Page to enroll in LCC's welding program at age 29 (just shy of LCC's average age of 30). She graduated in 2021, and is now working toward becoming a Certified Pipe Welder with United Association (UA) Local 26.

Nicole's current project with employer JH Kelly involves a remodel of the Longview PeaceHealth facility's eighth floor. Once that's complete, she'll be moving into the fabrication shop, which is specifically for pipe workers. In addition to welding, Nicole notes that "my job involves a lot of blueprint reading. Although I'm just starting my second year on the job, I'm finding that the classes I took at LCC prepared me well. I couldn't be more thankful for the conversations I had with instructors at LCC about their experiences out in the field."

Because Nicole received a lot of scholarship support while she was at LCC, she had the financial freedom to apply herself to her studies. She made the dean's list once, and was on the president's list every other quarter while completing her degree. She even had an opportunity to express her creative side with some welding art.

Although Nicole had never welded before starting her program at LCC, in high school she split her time between woodshop and the CAD (Computer Aided Design) lab. Although

it was a heavy load for a high school student to carry, she rose to the challenge. Nicole enjoys spreading the word about the opportunities working in the trades can offer to aspiring students, and has spoken to middle school and college students about her experiences. She also recently shared her story at a career fair focused on the trades.

In spite of having graduated, Nicole is very excited about the planned new Vocational Building at LCC. "The new space will allow for bigger and grander tools and will be beneficial for preparing people to work in the field. I would love to see specialized metal stations (for example), and more simulations for things like rigging and crane operating," she said, which would further tie the program to the needs of industry. "Outside of the welding lab, Theory and Fabrication was my favorite class (at LCC), which was held in a classroom. It would be much better in a lab space," she added.

Access to LCC's high quality welding program was the key to Nicole finding her niche in what she describes as a life changing career. "I can hold my own, but can really do so with the strong foundation I was given here. I've proven that I'm not just a minority (as a woman working in the trades). I am happy to help blaze that trail. I don't have the right words to express how thankful I am for this program," she said.



Driving Innovation The Center for Vocational & Transitional Studies

LCC will create a new 46,000 square foot facility to replace three vocational and science buildings, designed and constructed more than 60 years ago. The new building will bring together the College's welding, machining, and manufacturing programs and provide modernized facilities for information technology and computer science programs.

The center will also house the college's Transitional Studies programs, soon to be renamed College and Career Preparation. This cluster of programs includes high school completion, math and English preparation for entry into college level studies, and English language learning.

Students will go directly from college to career, filling the high-demand and living wage jobs of today and tomorrow.

LCC is working to secure capital funding for the new building through the state. To complete the facility, the College is seeking community support to bring in new, state-of-the-art equipment. Cutting-edge tools and equipment will ensure the new vocational center becomes a world-class skills center serving local high schools, industry, and unions.


