Celebrating 85 Years of Excellence in Education

As I reflect on LCC's humble beginnings, it is with gratitude for the individuals who believed in the value of a community college and the role of education as a catalyst for quality of life. Lower Columbia Junior College (LCJC) opened its doors on October 2, 1934 with 53 students enrolled in the first classes. Until the purchase of 26 acres in 1942, classes were held at R.A. Long High School, the Longview Public Library and downtown businesses. It was not until 1950 that the Main Building was constructed.

Today, the college is a comprehensive community and technical college offering 70+ programs. LCC serves over 4,000 students each quarter and rates near the top of the state in student completion rates. Recently we added our first baccalaureate degree: the Bachelor of Applied Science in Teacher Education (BAS-TE). This past decade, we gained a new state-of-the-art Health & Science building, opened a Regional University Center, finished significant updates to our Main Building, and renovated our Gym and Fitness Center which was recently named the Stoller Athletic Center. A "new" Vocational Building is next on the horizon that we believe will become the epicenter for workforce skills and industry training in the area.

It is wonderful to honor the past and celebrate where we are today, but it is the future that captures our collective imagination of what the next 85 years will bring to LCC's story!

Joe Fischer 2019-20 Benefactor of the Year

The Lower Columbia College Foundation has named Joe Fischer as the 2019-20 Benefactor of the Year. Benefactor honorees have a history of providing charitable financial support to the foundation, and/or significant volunteer service to the college. Most notably, contributions from honorees have had major impacts on the college, its programs, students, and the community. "It is with great pleasure that we announce and honor Joe Fischer as this year's Benefactor of the Year," said Rich Gushman, LCC Foundation Board Chair.

Joe served in the US Air Force from 1951-55. Joe earned his Bachelor of Science degree in 1960 and a Master of Fine Arts in 1963 from the University of Oregon. He went on to work for State University of New York (SUNY) at Buffalo from 1965-1994, where he designed a new Craft Center facility which included four studios that housed pottery, weaving, photography, and jewelry programs. While at SUNY, Joe served as Art Gallery Director from 1966-70. From 1963-65, Joe worked as the Director of Craft Center at Nellis Air Force Base in Las Vegas, Nevada where he taught art courses. In 1965, Joe returned to Buffalo where he taught as an Adjunct Professor of the arts for Empire State College until 1994.

In 1996, Joe married his late wife, Alona Forsberg Fischer and they happily made their home in Longview. Joe's philanthropic support to LCC includes the establishment of the Joe and Alona Fischer Art Scholarship, the Carl Forsberg Business Endowed Scholarship, and the Carl and Alona Forsberg Art Endowed Scholarship, in addition to his support of men's basketball, the art gallery, and Connecting Waters. Joe painted a mural in LCC's Head Start building and most recently was featured in the *Salal Review* with his submission of an acrylic painting of "Johari Jumping With Dany." "Joe has been a visible and involved supporter of LCC throughout the years, and we are pleased to honor his contributions and support of the arts," said Kendra Sprague, LCC Vice President of Foundation, HR & Legal Affairs.

Joe's professional career also included 25 juried exhibitions featuring his works of art throughout New York, Canada, Texas, Oregon, the Midwest, and at LCC. One of Joe's many awards includes the interrupted landscape painting of Lake Sacajawea, which was selected for LCC's permanent collection in 2005. Joe's community service includes that of advisor, coordinator, program assistant,



and art chairman for various festivals, auctions, and at SUNY. "I have always been very devoted to students, regardless of whether the work was paid or unpaid. I enjoyed teaching and used it to introduce students to the arts and inspired many student to go on and become serious artists," shares Joe.

Sharing the love of arts continues to inspire Joe's passion and generosity for helping others through gifts of time and philanthropy. "Joe clearly understands the important impact that community colleges have in their communities. His generosity will provide support to students and art programs at LCC for years to come," shares Chris Bailey, LCC President.

Joe will be honored at the 2020 LCC Foundation Horns & Halos Gala in September.

Synthetic Cadaver Gives Students Real Experience

The opportunity to learn with the aid of high-tech equipment in labs and classrooms sets LCC students apart. It is unusual for a community college to own a Syndaver, a synthetic female cadaver, made of organic tissues and compounds like silicone. LCC continues to ensure we have up-to-date technology to educate health students. The Syndaver is made with incredible detail, mirroring real flesh and organs in pigment and color. Right now, anywhere from 75-100 dental hygiene, pre-medical, physical therapy, and other health students use the Syndaver every quarter. Students can more easily access the Syndaver than the real cadaver (which LCC also owns). The Syndaver is part of LCC's long-term goals of increasing enrollment and expanding programs. The investment in a variety of state-of-the-art equipment in the Health & Science Building has created dynamic learning environments for students.



John Fitzpatrick Named 2020 Transforming Lives Award Winner

John Fitzpatrick never went to high school; instead, he got caught up in a life of crime beginning as a young child. Eventually, he spent a decade behind bars. While incarcerated, John took a college readiness course through Centralia College and decided to apply for a scholarship from the mikeroweWORKS Foundation (Mike Rowe is the host of television show Dirty Jobs).



Rowe's required video application posed a tremendous challenge for John, since video equipment is not permitted in correctional facilities in Washington. While a less determined person might have given up, John pursued the appropriate permissions and sent in his application. He was dumbfounded when he received the \$12,000 award.

Not everyone was pleased with John's scholarship. Rowe received public criticism from members of his fan base for "wasting" the money on a convict. He took to the airwaves to respond to his critics.

Mike Rowe, in response to criticism about John Fitzpatrick's scholarship award, asked "What's the point of paying your debt to society, if society never forgives the loan? Unless we're willing to lock up every criminal, forever, the question is, what's best for society? I mean, who

would you rather live next to? A former convict who has a useful skill and a full-time job, or a former convict with no skill, no prospects, and no hope of re-assimilating?"

After initially attending another institution, John is now in his second year of the Diesel and Heavy Equipment program at Lower Columbia College. In spite of encountering a host of barriers including homelessness, John's positive attitude and determination are both evident and infectious.

Shalaina Williams, the LCC employee who nominated John for the award states, "You will not find a more humble and hardworking student on the LCC campus. He does not feel entitled to anything and does not ask for handouts. He believes hard work and determination will get you far in life, and I admire this about him."

John faces ongoing challenges in life, but is determined to accomplish his goal of finishing a degree and working in the skilled trades industry. "I have allowed others to see the good and the bad in my life, and not all the time did I make honorable, law-abiding decisions in the things I did. So I had to reach back to my early teachings and regain a good work ethic so I could start exemplifying and showing my basic teachings learned through Bible principles. I accept the horrible decisions I have made in my life and from my own experience in change. Change is hard, very hard outside of the norm but in the same sentence, change is a choice."



James A. Nelson Woodland Friends of LCC Scholarship – Scholarship Spotlight

The Woodland Friends of LCC Scholarship was originally established in 2015, through collaborative efforts between Woodland High School and a group of Woodland community members to better serve Woodland students. Scholarship funds have been provided each year through local fundraising efforts led by Tim Welch and Lee Hutton-Welch,



Tom Golik, Ron Nelson, Benno and Klazina Dobbe, and Woodland Rotary. Since 2015, a total of \$12,700 has been awarded to six Woodland students. The purpose of the scholarship is to assist LCC students who live in Woodland, attend LCC full time, and have a minimum 2.5 grade point average. Students interested in pursuing vocational training are strongly encouraged to apply. First priority goes to Woodland High School graduating seniors.

In 2019, the scholarship was renamed the “James A. Nelson Woodland Friends of LCC Scholarship” in honor of a significant gift received from benefactor, James “Jimmy” Nelson of Woodland, in the amount of \$100,000. Jimmy owned and managed a Woodland Bottoms cattle ranch for 40 years and worked at Weyerhaeuser for 38 years. Though he did not have any formal education, he was raised in a ranching family where he realized the value of hard work. Jimmy learned of the scholarship through close friend, Tim Welch, a passionate advocate for LCC and Woodland students.

Jimmy’s passion for helping kids in Woodland began while umpiring Little League baseball. He often hired kids to work on his ranch and continues to follow their progress. Now that many of those kids are graduating, and with the recent sale of a portion of his ranch, Jimmy decided it was time to make a meaningful donation in support of Woodland students attending LCC.

Earlier this year, Jimmy suffered a stroke leaving him paralyzed, speech impaired, and with vision loss. When Jimmy’s uncle, Ron, asked why this donation was so important to him, Jimmy responded from his bed, “They need help in paying for their education, and need to be rewarded for all their hard work!” Ron shares how his nephew looks forward to meeting scholarship recipients and states, “It is my nephew, Jimmy’s intent to reinvest in his community by assisting young people through education and service.”

Student Success Fund

The Student Success Fund provides emergency grants to LCC students who are most at-risk for abandoning higher education goals due to financial hardships. It supports one of LCC's retention and completion goals for students by providing vital support to encourage completion.

Since 2012, the fund has provided more than \$415,000 in emergency grants to more than 800 students with great need. The average award is \$500. For many students, this grant means the difference between completing their program or dropping out.

The Student Success Fund works! Completion rates for LCC's Student Success Fund recipients is nearly double that of all LCC students.

The Student Success Fund helps students with:

- Tuition expenses not covered by financial aid, scholarships, or other grants
- Testing fees
- Tools and other school supplies
- Emergency housing and heating costs
- Emergency childcare expenses
- Emergency transportation



Student Athlete Spotlight

When Lower Columbia College coaches recruit student athletes, they are looking for talented players with good character and academic potential. When prospective Red Devils agree to come to Longview to join the Red Devil family, they are thinking about playing well, winning championships, and going on to the four-year level. Sometimes those dreams have to be altered. Bobbi Mott is a talented All-Alaska girls basketball player from Valdez who signed on for LCC head coach Lucas Myers' vision of winning a championship and excelling in the classroom. She joined the Red Devil team in the fall of 2018 and it was obvious that she was one of the top players on the team. In just her third game at LCC, Mott went down with a season-ending left knee injury. It was a big blow to the Red Devil team. Mott had surgery and began a year-long rehabilitation in hopes of playing again this season. Then it happened again: the same knee and the same injury in a game at Linn-Benton December 21. "It's been very disappointing to have this happen to me again," said Bobbi. "But I must say, I have no regrets coming to Longview. Lucas made sure I stayed on task in the classroom. The nursing program and the LCC emphasis on academics was the main reason I came here." Mott could have left the team last season, but she felt it was important to not only stay in school, but to stay engaged with the team. She rarely ever missed a practice despite having to watch from the sidelines. "Being a part of the team has really helped me stay academically motivated. All the support of the coaches and my teammates despite not being able to play has been incredible." Although her basketball goals have slipped away, her career goals of being a nurse have not. Mott achieved a 4.0 GPA in three of her four quarters so far at LCC. "Although things did not go as expected with basketball, my time at LCC has been incredible. Being around the energy of this campus and the great friends I've met, I have no regrets," she said. "LCC is a special place."

Champions on the Field and in the Classroom

Many college athletic programs claim they take academics seriously. The LCC athletics program has data and commemorative hardware to back it up! For the first time in the history of the NWAC Conference, one school has won the Presidents Cup for academic excellence and the Athletic Directors Cup for excellence in competition: LCC! The Red Devils had a cumulative 2.82 GPA for all six sports. Ten LCC student athletes achieved 4.0 GPA's. "This goes to show that you don't have to compromise academics when trying to compete in college athletics," said athletic director Kirc Roland. "The support we receive from the Lower Columbia College Foundation including our Booster Club members is the key to this great honor."

The Devils have won the AD Cup for three straight years. The Athletic Directors Cup is awarded to the NWAC college that garners the most points in a system using league standings and conference tournament results. Five of the six LCC teams made the post season including the baseball team that won the championship. "What a great testimony to our campus and community," said Roland.



The 2019 Lower Columbia College baseball team achieved a milestone that has only been accomplished by, well, the 1997 Lower Columbia College baseball team. The Devils defeated Everett 2-0 on Memorial Day to win the NWAC title for a third straight season. Justin Solt pitched seven innings of shutout baseball and Rance Pittman escaped a ninth inning jam to lead the team to a wild celebration. Actually, the Devils got to jump on top of each other twice when a lengthy video replay confirmed a game-ending close play at third base. It was another magical moment at Story Field as LCC captured the three-peat. Head Coach Eric Lane was a player on the 2010 Red Devil team that won the championship and he was an assistant coach for two titles. Now he is a champion head coach in each of his first two seasons at the helm of the program. "This is never easy and it never gets old," said coach Lane. "Our players have been blessed to see all of their hard work get awarded with a championship. Baseball is a game of inches and that last game could have gone the other way. But our guys always make sure they work hard to be in position to win." The Devils are currently working hard to try and do what no NWAC team has ever done. The quest for four straight is well underway. The season begins February 29.

Making Her Dreams Come True

Maria Bueno BAS-TE Scholarship Recipient

Maria Bueno is one of 24 students accepted into the first cohort of LCC's new Bachelors of Applied Science in Teacher Education program. Maria was thrilled not only to learn she had been accepted into the new program, but that she also was the recipient of a scholarship sponsored by the Lower Columbia Retired Educators Association.

Maria grew up in a family that struggled to make ends meet. When Maria was seven years old, she recalls waking up at 4:00 a.m. to head to the berry fields to help her parents and earn money. Though Maria's family worked long days to ensure their family's basic needs were met, they did not have money for any extras. For teenage Maria, it was difficult to understand why she was not able to have the lifestyle her school friends had.

Education in Maria's household was not a priority. Her mother did not finish the first grade and her father only had a fourth grade education. As the eldest child of parents who do not speak English, it became Maria's responsibility to help her parents translate and communicate at doctors appointments, with school staff, and in many other situations. While Maria was in high school, her father suffered a major injury on-the-job, leaving him disabled and requiring surgery. Since her parents were unable to speak English, it was imperative for Maria to help interpret at his doctor's appointments. Soon, her grades dropped. At the end of her junior year of high school, she realized she was not on track to graduate. She shares that she was embarrassed to be the only one of her friends who would not graduate from high school and that motivated her to work hard. She succeeded and graduated on time.

One year later, Maria became pregnant. Her father's extreme disappointment was devastating to Maria, but instead of allowing the situation to derail her goals, she allowed it to inspire her to pursue a better future. After having her children, Maria returned to school and graduated from LCC with her Associate's Degree with honors. In addition to returning to school, Maria is a mother of two who continues to help her parents and siblings, and works for the Longview School District as a para-educator. If not for this opportunity to earn her four-year degree locally, she would never have been able to achieve her dream of becoming a teacher. She is passionate about teaching and works hard to fulfill her dream of earning her Bachelor of Applied Science in Teacher Education degree which will change the lives of herself, her family, and positively impact the lives of her future students. "As a little girl, I never in a thousand years, would've thought I would be where I am today. If you would have told me that I, Maria Bueno, would be in a BAS program I would have probably laughed," Maria shared.


Jenna Lafontaine was Activities Director for the Associated Students of Lower Columbia College and a member of Phi Theta Kappa. In her

Mr. Richard (Dick) Peters 2019 LCC Alumnus of the Year

Dick graduated from R.A. Long in 1950 and attended LCC from 1950-53. While attending LCC, he drove a bus for Longview schools, picking up students in the morning, parking the bus near the college while attending classes, and driving students home in the afternoon. He also worked in a local mechanic shop and on his family’s dairy farm. During the Korean War, college students like Dick were allowed to continue their education and defer participation in the draft until they finished. After graduating from LCC, Dick went on to study forestry at the University of Washington, graduating in 1956.



In 2012, Dick was inducted into the R.A. Long Hall of Fame. His extensive local community service includes the Citizen Vocational Advisory Committee for Cowlitz County, Cowlitz Farm Forestry Association, R.A. Long Hall of Fame Committee, Cowlitz County Rural Library, Cowlitz County Septic System Advisory Committee, and Lower Columbia College Feasibility Study. Dick has been involved in community service in every community he lived and worked.

Dick wants people to understand the importance of vocational careers. Vocational skills translate into business skills as they provide a basic foundational understanding of the mechanics of running a successful organization. Dick shares, “With skills, anyone can do it [vocational trades]. You just have to have the desire and work ethic to go with it. As for this award, it is totally unexpected. I serve my community because I enjoy it, and it has served me well.”

Dick, and his wife, Judi, have supported LCC for more than 20 years and actively attend LCC events. They are strong supporters of LCC’s vocational and scholarship programs, and established the Dick and Judi Peters Vocational Scholarship. Other contributions include the Health and Science Fund, Innovation Fund, Student Success Fund, Vocational Scholarship Fund, College Success Fund, and Unrestricted Fund.

Alumni Spotlight – Dr. Edward L. Smith, PhD



Dr. Edward L. Smith, PhD who attended Lower Columbia Junior College (LCJC) from 1949-1951, was one of the first class of students following the opening of LCC's first official building on campus. Originally from a small farm near Castle Rock, "Little Eddie," played second base for LCJC's baseball team. He was a member of LCC's infamous Stella Birdhikers Club and is a talented musician, playing the drums.

After leaving LCJC in 1951, Ed became a professional musician. He played jazz and big band music for jazz clubs and big ballrooms, including gigs in Las Vegas at the Sands and Sahara, and in New York's Palladium Ballroom, where he played for famous musicians such as Louis Prima, Cal Tjader, and Harry James. In the late 1950s, rock and roll took over the music scene and he traded his professional drum sticks for pencils and returned to school. Ed earned his BS in Physics in 1964 and MS in Physical Sciences in 1967 from San Diego State University. He continued his education at Scripps Institute and earned his PhD in Oceanography in 1971. Ed worked under a Presidential Appointment for the military and government until 1982 when he started BK Dynamics, Inc., a consulting firm for intelligence and undersea research, which he sold upon retirement in 1994. Ed remains active playing weekly jazz gigs and consulting for the University of Washington on the study of propagation of underwater sound.

Recently, Dr. Smith returned to LCC for a "Back to Campus" reunion with former classmates from 1950-53 where the group reacquainted themselves while touring the growing campus. He fondly recalls his time as a student and athlete at LCC and continues his connections as a generous supporter of LCC athletics and college success.

Dedication of Honored Spaces

Forsberg Art Gallery

The LCC Foundation received a major gift in memory of Carl and Alona Forsberg in support of LCC's art programs and art and business scholarships. The gallery in the Rose Center is now the *Forsberg Art Gallery*.

As a young man, Carl had always wanted to go to college, but due to the Great Depression, was forced to work, becoming a young entrepreneur. He transformed several business ventures into successful enterprises. Carl served on the Longview City Council in the 1940s. After his passing, Alona, who retired from Bell Telephone Company, continued to successfully manage and grow their joint investments.

Alona remarried Joe Fischer in 1996. In honor of Carl and Alona, Joe established two endowments totaling \$500,000: the Carl and Alona Forsberg Memorial Endowed Art Scholarship and the Carl Forsberg Memorial Business Scholarship. "This naming is a tribute to Carl and Alona who thought highly of LCC and the opportunities LCC provides to the local community," shares Joe.



Stoller Athletic Center



The *Stoller Athletic Center* is the state-of-the-art facility that houses Myklebust Gymnasium as well as the Fitness Center. This space honors LCC 1971 Alumnus and 2017 Athletics Hall of Famer, Bill Stoller, and his wife LaRue. The Stoller Family Foundation made a remarkable gift to the LCC Foundation in support of the Athletic Excellence Fund as well as areas of greatest need. Stoller was a member of the 1970 LCC Basketball team that took second at the NWAC Tournament and the 1971 team, which finished sixth. After attending LCC, Stoller went on to play at Pacific University in Forest Grove, Oregon. Stoller is co-founder, CEO, and chairman of the board for Express Employment

Professionals. Stoller is also president of The Stoller Group, owning 27 Express offices in Oregon, Washington, Arizona, Nevada, Colorado, and California. He also owns Xenium, a professional employer organization, and the Stoller Family Estate, a vineyard and winery located on nearly 400 acres in the heart of Oregon's Willamette Valley.
