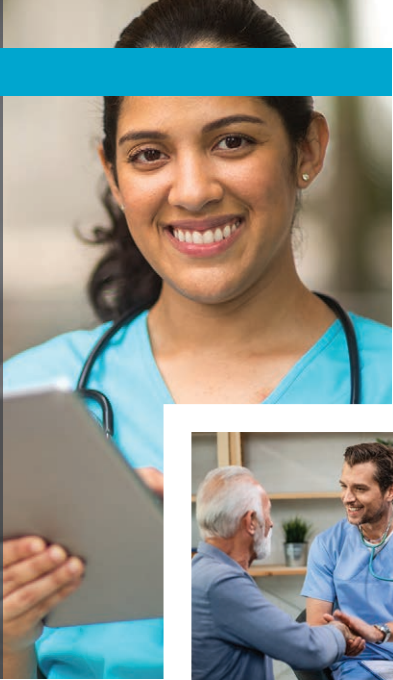

REGISTERED NURSE DUTIES

- Administer medications
- Initiate and manage intravenous access
- Perform treatments and certain tests
- Document treatment and client response
- Order, interpret and evaluate diagnostic tests
- Develop (implement and evaluate) plans of care
- Apply nursing judgment to guide decisions in patient care
- Administer primary and emergency care
- Collaborate with the interdisciplinary team
- Direct and guide ancillary personnel
- Manage, supervise and assist nursing staff
