Inspired by poets as diverse as Theodore Roethke, Federico García Lorca and Robert Wrigley, Peter Ludwin is drawn to physical and spiritual aspects of the natural world, different cultures, history and the quality of being alive in the moment. He has found richness especially in the American West and the celebratory cultures of Greece and Mexico. The recipient of a Literary Fellowship from Artist Trust, the W.D. Snodgrass Award for Endeavor and Excellence in Poetry and the Muriel Craft Bailey Memorial Award for his poem "Wolf Concerto," he also won the 2024 Trail to Table Editors' Award in Poetry for his newest collection, *An Altar of Tides*.
