The student financial aid system is based on the premise that your parents have the primary responsibility to assist you with your college education until you are at least 24 years old, even if that assistance is only to provide their information for your FAFSA. Federal regulations allow the Lower Columbia College financial aid administrator to consider extraordinary cases on an individual basis. In unusual circumstances, using professional judgment, the financial aid administrator *may* determine that you should be considered independent for financial aid eligibility based on information you provide. This decision is final and cannot be appealed.

Per Department of Education rules, the following conditions <u>do not</u> qualify as unusual circumstances and therefore, <u>cannot</u> be used as reasons to make a student independent from their parents:

- Your parents are refusing to monetarily contribute your education
- Your parents unwilling to provide information on the FAFSA or for income verification
- Your parents do not claim you as a dependent for income tax purposes
- You live on your own and are financially self sufficient

If any of these conditions apply to your situation, you cannot be declared independent from your parents. However, you may be eligible for a Direct Unsubsidized Loan only. If you wish to be considered for a Direct Unsubsidized Loan, complete the Parents Refusal to Provide Information form available in the LCC Financial Aid Office.

Provide the following information and documentation:

Step 1: Complete and submit Verification Worksheet and all documents, if requested by the Financial Aid Office.

	Unaccompanied Youth/Homeless. This means you lack permanent, consistent, and adequate housing. It includes, temporarily living with other people because you have nowhere else to go, living in substandard housing, i.e. no water or electricity, living in emergency or transitional shelter, living in motels or campgrounds, cars, parks, abandoned buildings, bus or train stations, or any public or private place not designed for humans to live in	□ Letter from school district liaison, homeless shelter, homeless service provider/agency, financial administrator from another college, off campus mental health professional or social worker, doctors, or clergy
	Both parents deceased since filing the FAFSA	☐ Death certificates and/or obituary notices
