- 1. This scholarship is for students who are Cowlitz County residents enrolling in a one or two-year technical program in the <u>trades, manufacturing, industrial or vocational fields</u> (see page 2 for details).

- 3. Preference will be given to applicants whose annual family income is below \$100,000.
- 4. This scholarship award is for \$3,000 for the 2025-26 academic year.
- 5. Funds will be forwarded to the school or trade institution of your choice after Altrusa International of Longview-Kelso has received your acceptance of the scholarship.

Payment will be made directly to the training school.

Criteria upon which the award will be based are:

- 1. Commitment to chosen career.
- 2. School and community engagement.
- 3. Evidence of passing grades/progress.
- 4. Financial need.
- 5. Good communication skills/quality of application.
