

Director's Notes

So much has been written by and about English playwright, composer, director, actor, singer, and would-be WWII spy Sir Noël Coward, that my notes here seem hopelessly insufficient. His professional career began on stage at the tender age of 11 and ended 58 years later when he acted in the film, The Italian Job. While friends knew Coward was gay, it was impossible to be publicly out for most of his career: homosexuality was illegal in Britain until five years before his death in 1973. Coward's distinctly British, witty, and flamboyant public image defined an era of dry sophistication. Time Magazine characterized him as "a combination of cheek and chic, pose and poise." Blithe Spirit, acknowledged as the best of his 50 plays, was famously written in five days during the German Blitz on London. Coward somehow managed to craft a comedy about death in the midst of death that resonated with his resolute audience. Blithe Spirit broke box-office records with Coward remarking of opening night, "The audience had to walk across planks laid over the rubble caused by a recent air raid to see a light comedy about death. They enjoyed it, I am glad to say, and it ran from that sunny summer evening through the remainder of the war and out the other side."

We invite you to enjoy the sparkling wit and fun of *Blithe Spirit*. In dialogue with *Rhinoceros*, our fall production of lonesco's look at the rise of Fascism and WWII, Coward's play offers a brilliant diversion from the war.





Theatre Arts Classes and Opportunities

Spring Quarter 2025 Drama Classes Behind the Scenes and Onstage

DRMA 101: Introduction to Theatre is a college transfer course that studies the history, development, and the many areas of theater required to produce a play. In addition to directing, acting, and playwriting, students will learn about set, light, and costume design through the study of the current Center Stage play and other plays from various periods of history. Taught by Betsy Richard.

DRMA 108 & 208: Acting are college transfer classes that study the methods, techniques, and theories of acting as an art form. Taught by Betsy Richard in Center Stage Theater. This course is offered every quarter as DRMA 106/206, 107/207, 108/208 and each quarter focuses on a unique aspect of Acting. Spring Quarter's focus is audio narration and video self tapes. The courses do not have to be taken in sequence.

DRMA 116/117/118: Stagecraft are college transfer courses that teach the basic principles of stage design, lighting, and construction of sets for our productions! Enjoy fun, hands-on education taught by our expert technical theater instructor Robert Cochran. This course does not need to be taken in sequence and is offered every quarter

DRMA 198/298: Theater Rehearsal and Performance is a college transfer course that invites you to work on a Center Stage production! Each term LCC does a fully produced, **fully face to face** play. Auditions are the first week of each term, and you can earn credits by working on stage or offstage in the beautiful Center Stage Theatre. Instructor permission required. Betsy Richard directs.

Act One Drama Club produces each quarter's play selection, participates in Campus Culture, and takes field trips to Seattle and Portland to see plays and tour theaters! To become a part of the teamwork and fun, join us in the greenroom and shop of The Rose Center for the Arts Fridays at 10AM.
