

#### **Director's Notes**

Audiences may remember LCC Drama's film productions of Karen Zacarías' *Native Gardens* and *The Story About the Tattoo*. We are happy to introduce you to her *The Book Club Play*. Born in Mexico, Zacarías moved to Boston as a 10-year-old where she was teased by her classmates for her accent, long braids, and the way she dressed. Longing to return to Mexico, she coped by writing imaginary conversations where she cleverly vanquished her taunters.

Today Zacarías makes her home in Washington D.C. with her husband and three children. She is one of the most widely produced playwrights in the United States. Her numerous awards include the National Latino Playwriting Award and the New Voices Award. She founded Young Playwrights' Theater (YPT) and developed AROW (Abolishing Racism and Oppression in the Workplace), an initiative that helps organizations build "antiracist and antioppressive structures and practices." Zacarías also cofounded Latinx Theatre Commons, which promotes Latino equity in the theater.

In a 2019 TEDx Talk, Zacarías said, "I like not being put in a box, I think all of my plays are about breaking some kind of expectation or stereotype."

Book lovers will be interested to note that Zacarías' newest play, an adaptation of Edith Wharton's *The Age of Innocence*, is currently enjoying its world premiere at San Diego's Old Globe Theater.

# **Theatre Arts Classes and Opportunities**

## Spring Quarter 2024 Drama Classes Behind the Scenes and Onstage

**DRMA 101: Introduction to Theatre** is a college transfer course that studies the history, development, and the many areas of theatre required to produce a play. In addition to directing, acting, and playwriting, students will learn about set, light, and costume design through the study of the current Center Stage play and other plays from various periods of history. Taught by Betsy Richard.

**DRMA 108 & 208:** Acting are college transfer classes that study the methods, techniques, and theories of acting as an art form. Taught by Betsy Richard in Center Stage Theater. This course is offered every quarter as DRMA 106/206, 107/207, 108/208 and each quarter focuses on a unique aspect of Acting. Spring Quarter's focus is On Camera and Voice Over Acting. The courses do not have to be taken in sequence.

**DRMA 116/117/118: Stagecraft** are college transfer courses that teach the basic principles of stage design, lighting, and construction of sets for our productions! Enjoy fun, hands-on education taught by our expert technical theater instructor Robert Cochran. This course does not need to be taken in sequence and is offered every quarter

**DRMA 198/298: Theater Rehearsal and Performance** is a college transfer course that invites you to work on a Center Stage production! Each term LCC does a fully produced, **fully face to face** play. Auditions are the first week of each term, and you can earn credits by working on stage or offstage in the beautiful Center Stage Theatre. Instructor permission required. Betsy Richard directs.

**Act One Drama Club** produces each quarter's play selection, participates in Campus Culture, and takes field trips to Seattle and Portland to see plays and tour theaters!
