

#### **Director's Notes**

David Auburn's Pulitzer Prize winning play *Proof* brings LCC Center Stage's 2018/19 Season to a close, ending our season of plays focusing on identity. Like fall quarter's *True West*, *Proof* explores the question of inheritance: how much are we destined to become our parents? While *True West* and *The Importance of Being Earnest* focused on parental absence, *Proof* looks squarely at the complex relationship between a father and a daughter. Catherine, the young woman at the heart of the play, is struggling to emerge and separate from years of caregiving and sacrifice while haunted by the fear of inheriting her father's mental instability. The mathematical genius passed down from her father seems to suggest that she is also destined to struggle with mental illness. Does claiming one confirm the presence of the other?

#### **Cast and Production Biographies**

James Eikrem (Guest Artist - Robert) is Artistic Director/Theater Instructor at Clackamas Community College. Jim holds an MFA from NYU's Graduate Acting Program and is a Certified Associate Teacher of Fitzmaurice Voicework®. His acting, directing, and teaching credits span the United States and include work in Japan. **Shandi Muff (Costume/Makeup Design)** is an actor, writer and designer. Auditions are the first week of each term, and you can earn credits by working on stage or off in the beautiful Center Stage Theatre. Instructor permission required. Betsy Richard directs.
